*All prices are based on a quick search of the cheapest available product in your local pharmacy (as at May 2016). **It costs more to the NHS than the purchase price from pharmacies and supermarkets because the NHS price is set nationally and additional fees are added to cover the process of checking and dispensing the prescription. There are also costs to the NHS associated with GP and nurse appointments and time spent by prescription clerks.
